MARYGROVE CAMP: The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Toronto Central Council, helps over 1,000 girls each summer, registering eligible campers through home visits. Marygrove Camp is a residential camp situated on Georgian Bay, Ontario. Open to eligible girls ages 5 – 13, Marygrove provides a camping experience for children who may not otherwise have the opportunity to enjoy a camping adventure. Families who are experiencing financial or domestic hardship may contact the Society directly to determine their eligibility.

Each camper's holiday is subsidized through the generous support of our parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto. This collection will take place on Saturday and Sunday, June 12 and 13.
