History/Description:	Founded by Blessed James Alberione, SSP in Alba, Italy in 1917, the Pauline Cooperators have been an integral part of the religious family founded by Bl. Alberione. Cooperators assist in the mission of the Pauline Family in various ways: through material gifts; financial support; assisting in the Pauline Centres or the Liturgical Apostolate Centres; assisting the priests and Sisters of the various Pauline orders; offering hospitality; writing; promoting editions; working on radio or other media to promote the gospel, etc. Cooperators share in the spirituality of the Pauline family by learning and practicing devotion to Jesus, Master, Way and Truth and Life especially worshipped in the Eucharistic Sacrifice (the Mass) and in Eucharistic adoration; through study and prayer with the Sacred Scriptures; the devotion to Mary as Queen of the Apostles; and devotion to St. Paul the Apostle are essential elements of Pauline Spirituality.
Organizational Structure:	The cooperators are unique in that they are listed under the Congregation for Religious and Secular Institutes, even though they are not bound by vows. The reason is that their ultimate Superior is the Father General of the Society of St. Paul. The Cooperators are an "aggregated" institute: aggregated, or in a sense, joined to, the Society of St. Paul. Their contact person in this Archdiocese is Sister Mary Peter Martin, fsp. The group meets monthly. When there are many Cooperators, the ideal is that each parish have its own group, with elected leaders, and a treasurer. However, the numbers here in Toronto vary from 15 to 20. Some members are more senior in years, and not as physically able to attend meetings which are part of their on-going formation.
Membership Criteria:	Catholic men and women who desire to grow in their spiritual life and who desire to assist the Pauline Family in any way open to them. Cooperators are to be able to represent the Pauline Institute to which they are attached, which requires an adequate human and Catholic formation, sufficient and balanced mental health, and a love for Catholic teaching, for the Holy Father, and for the mission of the Pauline Family. The Cooperators are encouraged to make a practice of Eucharistic Adoration whenever possible. The individual joining the Cooperators is asked to participate in a formation program to prepare oneself to make the Cooperator's Promise after at least 18 months of study of the Pauline Charism.

C. decided to support the efforts of Dr. Simone and started collecting and sending items to Toronto. Initially they worked from a church basement and the home of one of the original members of the B. C. group.</p> <p>1990, January 11 - "Canadian Food for Children, Co-Workers, B. C. Division", was registered as a charitable, non-profit society</p> <p>.</p> <p>Volunteers, donors, and financial supporters continued to grow and rapidly outpaced the the facility available to them.</p> <p>Through the generosity of Joseph and Loretta Krentz, three dairy barns on their property in Langley were converted to accommodate the growing organization.</p> <p>2005 - A second B.C. group, Canadian Food for Children Co-Workers - Okanagan Division, representing Penticton and Kelowna was officially registered as a distinct but supporting charity after many years of operating as a satellite location of the Langley depot.</p> <p>In 2005 the B.C. Division shipped directly from the port of Vancouver for the first time and continues direct shipments to destination developing countries when financially feasible.</p> <p>2007, January - In collaboration with Universal Aide Society, CFFC started shipping directly to additional countries such as the Philippines, Ghana, Romania, Ukraine, Nicaragua etc.</p> <p>This collaboration allows more of our donor dollars to be used for food purchases since Universal Aide Society generously assists with shipping costs.</p> <p>Today - Many dedicated volunteers work at the Langley depot throughout the week and in the community collecting supplies that are donated by a variety of groups. School students come to the Langley depot at various times to tour the facility or spend half a day working with the volunteers.</p> <p>Containers continue to be loaded at the Langley depot and transported by rail to the consolidated warehouse in Toronto or shipped directly to developing countries through collaboration with Universal Aide Society.</p>

Organizational Structure:	The CFC Council in Manila is the overall worldwide governing body of the Couples For Christ, and each country has a Country Coordinator, then comes the National Council of the country, headed by a National Director. Then each area like Toronto, Vancouver, Calgary, etc has an Area council headed by an Area Head or Director. Then follows, Sector Heads over Cluster Heads, who are followed by Chapter Heads.

Charism:	In a profound and intense way, we discover and understand God's deep love for us. We share that in a very normal & natural way in our everyday environments, especially with those who are faraway & distant from God.

History/Description:	The Cursillos in Christianity Movement was founded in Spain in 1944 by Eduardo Bonnin. Eduardo heard an address given by Pope Pius XI, which had a great impact on him & his friends. Eduardo began an intense Study of the Environment, trying to determine a way to make that environment into a Christian one. After participating in the Catholic Action short courses & pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela, Eduardo was concerned about what would happen after the Pilgrimages. So he & his friends developed their own short courses, which would last 3 days, aimed at those who were "faraway", "distant" from their Christian faith and the Church. The "Cursillos" or short courses, would bring people together from all walks of life; presentations were carried out by lay people who were sincerely living the Christian life in their everyday lives & by Priests, explaining the fundamental Christian message in a serious, deep & yet cheerful way. The challenges that the world presents to the person of today have the same root as they always did: the absence of God in the mind and in the heart of a person. "The Cursillos in Christianity Movement" is an instrument & place where man or woman can encounter themselves, Christ and others, allowing them to get to know, understand, respect & value one another, finally learning to love each other, gradually transforming the encounter into friendship - friendship with Christ & with others.
