St. Paul, who prophesied that every knee should bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, (Phil 1:10-11)

St. Paul, who urged Christians to stay awake and sober for the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night, (1 Thess 5:2)

St. Paul, who exhorted that all ought to work and not remain idle as mere busybodies, (2 Thess 3:11)

St. Paul, who urged that all Christians live a life worthy of their calling, (Eph 4:1)
