



Campaign Progress

Wave 3 parishes have raised over **\$4.1 million** in donations and pledges, **17%** of their collective goal. Congratulations to Fr. Jozef Vano, his team, and all of the generous parishioners of Sts. Cyril and Methodius Parish in Mississauga, the second Wave 3 parish to reach its goal.

The three parishes running active Combined Campaigns have raised **\$5.25 million** and achieved **88%** of their collective goal. Wave 2 parishes have raised **150%** of their collective goal with just over **\$40 million** in donations and pledges.

Overall, the campaign has raised gifts and pledges of **\$99.0 million** or **94%** of the Family of Faith campaign's minimum goal.

Important Information for Wave 3 Parishes

Here are some timely tips for pastors and volunteers working on their Wave 3 parish campaigns:

- A pastor's or volunteer's job is not done after an initial visit! 'Closing gifts' means following up with parishioners who have been informed about the Family of Faith campaign and then receiving a decision. Following up within one week of the invitation to participate is very important. Not everyone you invited will make a gift to the campaign. If they can't support the campaign, thank them for their consideration. Be prepared for further questions from these parishioners. If they have decided to make a pledge, ensure they know where to send their completed pledge form. Remember, timely follow-up is critical to receiving decisions.
- Pastors and volunteers sometimes find themselves needing to quickly summarize some aspects of the campaign. One common topic is the sharing formula. Most people tend to describe the formula as '25% up to goal for the parish and 75% for the archdiocese. After goal, the formula flips with 75% for the parish and 25% for archdiocese.'



It's pretty clear what we mean when we say 'parish' but it seems many people may not understand what is meant by 'archdiocese.' For this reason, we recommend alternate language when explaining the formula, as follows:

'25% up to goal for the parish's priorities and 75% for the overall Family of Faith plan. After goal, the formula flips with 75% for the parish and 25% for the overall plan.'

Wave 3 Campaign Updates

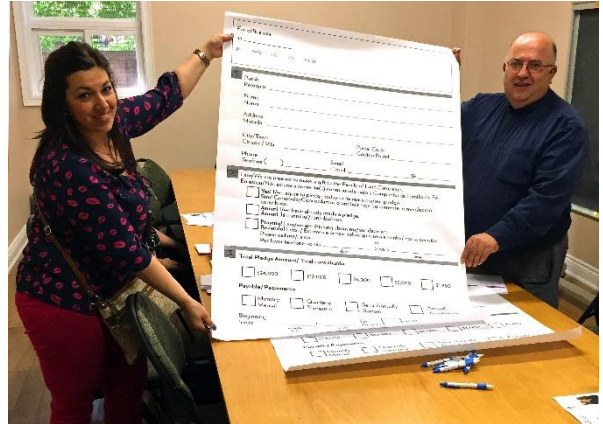
Nativity of Our Lord, Etobicoke: Fr. Machacek and his CEC team participated in a Major Gift Committee Training and Assignment session this past week. All Major Phase parishioners will be visited by members of the team over the next two weeks.

St. Pius X, Toronto: Fr. Park and his CEC are making follow up phone calls to those parishioners who were unable to attend the orientation session, and will host the Special Phase orientation on Monday June 15th.

St. Elizabeth of Hungary, North York: Fr. Jenó trained his Major Gift Committee volunteers to make visits to parishioners in the Major phase on Monday last week. His team is determined to close gifts in a timely matter. Sok szerencsét (Good luck)!

St. Charles Borromeo, Toronto: The CEC is making good progress toward 100% participation from the committee. Fr. Mario and the volunteers that have made pledges will be closing the remaining CEC gifts this week to build on the \$51,000 already raised toward the campaign goal.

St. Teresa's Parish, Etobicoke: Fr. Gabriel and Fr. Matthew have been busy meeting almost every parishioner in the Major Phase. Closing the initial CEC gifts has boosted the parish's total to \$41,500, or 13% of the parish goal.



Santa Cruz Parish, Toronto: Father Manuel and his volunteers have printed oversized pledge cards for its upcoming Commitment Weekend. This way it will be easier for Father to explain each section of the card.



St. Mary's Parish, Toronto: For the past six years, the parish has been involved in the restoration of its church, rectory and parish halls. It is a big project, and will soon pass the \$10 million mark.

With the funds that the parish receives from the Family of Faith campaign, it will pay down its debt to the archdiocese, owed for our church's restoration work.

St. Mary's, Toronto: The parish finance council is giving excellent support to the Campaign Executive Committee (CEC), by making follow-up calls and attending visits with potential donors.

St. Bartholomew Parish, Agincourt: Over the past three weeks, Fr. Foley and the CEC visited 38 parishioners. From these visits, 9 pledges were received, bringing the campaign total to \$128,000 (35% of goal). Keep up the good work!

Sts. Cyril and Methodius Parish, Mississauga: Thanks to the perseverance and tireless dedication of Fr. Vano and his invaluable staff and volunteers, the parish has raised \$242,200 (115%) of its goal! Congratulations!

St. Joseph the Worker, Thornhill: Fr. Salvadori, along with the many parishioners who have volunteered to help in this campaign, have raised over \$370,000 toward the parish goal of \$600,000. Congratulations to the entire team for the great results, because they set the stage for a successful balance of the campaign. Father and his team look forward to a successful Advance Phase Orientation Meeting that is scheduled for June 22nd.

St. Paul's Basilica Parish, Toronto: The campaign continues to move toward its campaign goal of \$295,000, raising over \$183,000 or 62%. From the over 43 parishioners now visited, 12 gifts have been made in support of the campaign. Fr. McDevitt, along with his CEC continues to demonstrate strong leadership. Well done!!

St. Joseph's, Beaverton: Fr. Oswin is busier than a beaver, writing personalized thank you cards for all of his campaign donors. He continues to meet with Major and Advance Phase parishioners.

St. Andrew's, Brechin: Thanks to the persistence of Fr. Anthony and his CEC, 15 of 22 Advance phase parishioners attended an information session on Tuesday last week. All will receive follow up visits over the next two weeks. Keep up the good work, team!

St. Martin of Tours, Mississauga: Fr. Joyson and his CEC announced their first gifts to the campaign last week, with \$14,000 raised this past week, for a total of \$20,000 to date, and more CEC gifts coming in daily.

Immaculate Conception, Sutton West: Fr. Sherwin held his first Advance Phase Orientation this past Thursday. Parishioners from Our Lady of the Lake and Immaculate Conception are excited about the ambitious goals of the campaign.

St. Margaret Mary, Woodbridge: Fr. Grayda and volunteers continued to follow up with pending parishioners. By simply following up, they received an additional 11 gifts last week and surpassed 80% of their campaign goal.

St. Monica's, Toronto: Fr. Damian followed up with pending committee members to receive their gifts before they begin meeting with their fellow parishioners and raised \$45,000.

St James, Toronto: Volunteers did a stupendous job of reaching out to families in the Advance Phase. After their hard work, 18 families attended the Advance Gift Orientation at St. James. Families have been responding and are showing signs of engagement.

Campaign Spotlight

The full 36 page Family of Faith case statement booklet outlines how funds from the Family of Faith campaign will be invested across the archdiocese. This week, we share excerpts highlighting “**St. Michael’s Cathedral**” and how the Archdiocese of Toronto’s Pastoral Plan is being put into action through donor support for the Family of Faith campaign.

“Construction of St. Michael’s Cathedral began in 1845. To prepare for the foundation, Catholics and Protestants worked side by side for one week excavating 95,000 cubic feet of earth, by hand.

As the mother church of the Archdiocese of Toronto, St. Michael’s Cathedral requires significant renovation and restoration work to maintain its beauty, accessibility and prominence as the spiritual centre of Canada’s largest *family of faith*.

Just as the family home grounds us in tradition, setting the tone for generations who will reach out beyond its doors for years to come, so too the cathedral reminds us of Peter, the rock on whom the Church was built, inspiring others to share the *Good News* in abundance. Our cathedral echoes the outreach provided by parishes across the archdiocese: care for the poor, sick and marginalized, a beacon of prayer and fellowship in the midst of a secular world, a home to welcome family, to meet us in our joys and struggles, to help, guide and care for us.

In recent years we have invested \$35 million in necessary restorations – first and foremost, to ensure the safety and stability of the cathedral. Additional work has involved the foundation and underpinning, the reinstallation of the loft (providing an additional 250 seats), the repair and conservation of exterior masonry, and maintenance of the Cathedral’s spire. With Canada’s largest city experiencing extensive growth, this new development also demands we increase our efforts to reach both the Catholic community and those requiring our care beyond the Church walls. To meet these diverse needs, we require a functional cathedral that is both pastoral and practical in its care and outreach in the downtown core and beyond.

Moving forward we plan to invest in solidifying the structure and enhancing the beauty of the cathedral. We will proceed in four phases starting at the entrance on the west and moving to the sanctuary in the east and then north to the St. John’s Chapel.

By investing **\$25 million** in the cathedral through the capital campaign, we will ensure the transformation of this historic structure continues. While there are still significant additional funds required for future work (\$60 million), we will look to annual operating funds as well as additional development opportunities to support this extensive and important work.”
