

Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA) Training Options

All clergy, employees, volunteers, and independent contractors are required to be trained on the AODA and on the Ontario Human Rights Code (OHRC) as it pertains to the AODA. The Archdiocese of Toronto has **training manuals** for this use. For Archdiocesan clergy and employees the training manual can be found on the employee website at <u>employee.archtoronto.org</u>. For volunteers and independent contractors you may find the training manual at this link: <u>AODA Training Manual for Volunteers & Independent Contractors</u>.

Alternatively, individuals may choose to complete **online training modules** for both the AODA and the OHRC; in order to fulfill this training requirement, you will need to view two individual websites and upon completion of all the training modules submit the AODA Training Acknowledgment form via SurveyMonkey (see below).

1. AODA Free Online Training

There are 6 modules with quizzes after each module. The training takes approximately 45 minutes to complete.

When completing the training you will click the forward arrow (at the bottom right of the presentation) to move to the next slide. When you complete a module, you will click "Continue to Next Module" (green button) on the last slide.

At the end of the training, a certificate will be emailed to you for your own records (it is not needed for Archdiocesan tracking). Upon completion, you may move on to the next training site below.

2. Ontario Human Rights Commission (OHRC) – Working Together: The Code and the AODA

A 5-part training module which will teach you about your rights and responsibilities under the Code and the AODA and how they affect you at work, in services and in housing. There are quizzes after each part and the training will take approximately 20 minutes to complete.

At the end of the training you will have the option of printing a certificate for your own records (it is not needed for Archdiocesan tracking).
