

Ministry Position: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Parish Coordinator

🔷 Position Overview

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) Parish Coordinator assumes an administrative role for a Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program. The Coordinator may or may not be a Catechist.

Activities/Responsibilities

- Act as contact person for the parish, promoting CGS within the parish and responding to inquiries about the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd
- Manage registration for the parish CGS program, receiving registration forms and fees, maintaining a master list of participating children and families, and providing updated copies of master list to the church office
- Keep parish staff informed of the schedule for the program and the rooms needed
- Maintain atrium environment
- Maintain contact list of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd catechists and families
- Maintain ongoing communication with the Catechists, arranging regular meetings for planning and communication purposes
- Ensure any changes to the list of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Catechists are communicated promptly to the Parish Volunteer Screening Committee

Other specifics:
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Skills, Experience and Qualifications

- Must be a fully initiated member of the Catholic Church in good standing
- Must be recognized within the parish community as a person of good reputation
- Must be at least 18 years of age
- Must hold a certificate in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program; experience as a Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Catechist is desirable
- Must possess appropriate leadership, facilitation, and organizational skills



- Must be able to relate effectively and communicate clearly with others
- Must maintain a helpful, supportive and non-threatening attitude in working with children and their parents
- Able to act in emergency situations with knowledge of program contacts and parish procedures

Personal Traits and Qualities

- Desires to serve the community and to commit time and talents to this ministry
- Is honest, dependable and can maintain strict confidentiality
- Pays close attention to detail
- Is able to work with Catechists in a spirit of unity and harmony, offering talents and experience for the good of all
- Possesses a deep sense of spirituality with a desire for further faith development
- Is comfortable with being accountable and is sensitive to the observance of proper boundaries

Screening Requirements

This is a High Risk/Position of Trust.

Before volunteering begins:

- Complete a Volunteer Application Form
- Attend interview and have personal references checked
- Complete a Police Information Check
- Complete appropriate training and orientation •

After volunteering begins:

- There will be supervision and periodic evaluations
- An annual Offence Declaration and a new Police Information Check every 5 years
- Participant follow-ups may be conducted



Orientation and Training

Standard parish orientation program, including AODA training.

As a Catechist, has completed the Level I: Foundations Course; Children Ages 3 - 6 component of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Certificate Program, jointly offered by the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Office/Archdiocese of Toronto and Continuing Education/University of St. Michael's College.

Has completed or is working towards completion of Level II: Children Ages 6-9 and Level III: Children Ages 9-12 is required.

Support, Supervision and Evaluation

The Pastor and/or Pastoral Team is the first level of support, supervision and evaluation. Support is offered through the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Office, Archdiocese of Toronto.

Length of Ministry Appointment

One (1) year term with the ability to renew.

Benefits and Working Conditions

- Will develop a deep satisfaction in providing support to the Catechists as they share the environment of prayer and reflection with the children

- Must be able to attend the orientation session and training sessions as required
