First Annual Dominican Friars' Youth Interfaith Video Contest (2022) Prize Distribution Ceremony

The Video Contest Theme: Cultivating Friendship & Solidarity

The Office for Interreligious Dialogue, Archdiocese of Toronto has successfully concluded its first annual Dominican Friars' Youth Interfaith Video Contest along with its partners, the *Catholic Register*, Salt + Light Media, Interfaith Youth Alliance Movement (IYAM) and Toronto Catholic School District Board. Students were invited to submit videos between February 4 and May 2, 2022, that highlighted how diverse religious communities can work together to rebuild, renew and restore our communities after the pandemic.

Despite being a brand-new idea, students and teachers supported the contest and showed their great interest in this initiative, which encouraged high school students from diverse religious and cultural backgrounds to engage with each other individually or in teams. This was one of the opportunities where they could cultivate friendship and solidarity by sharing their religious and cultural gifts. This would also lead them to a better understanding of their commonalities and differences.

Selection of winning videos:

This year's theme, Cultivating Friendship & Solidarity, was arrived at considering the United Nations International Day of Human Fraternity held on February 4th of each year.

A panel of media professionals selected the winners on overall merit, in consultation with the Office for Interreligious Dialogue, the Catholic Register, Salt + Light Media and Interfaith Youth Alliance Movement (IYAM).
