Canada-Ukraine Authorization for Emergency Travel (CUAET)

- Canada has not designated Ukrainian Nationals displaced by the war in Ukraine as refugees. They are currently designated as displaced persons.
- As such, Ukrainians <u>cannot</u> be sponsored as refugees under Canada's Private or Government Refugee Sponsorship Programs.
- The CUAET program was created by Immigration Canada for displaced Ukrainian Nationals. Program elements include:
 - No limit to the number of Ukrainians who can apply;
 - Approved applicants are granted temporary resident status for duration of their passport (if it expires in less than 3 years, the status can be extended;
 - Applicants can apply for work or study permits overseas. Majority have these permits prior to arrival;
 - Those arriving are eligible to attend elementary and secondary school;
 - Those arriving are able to apply for a SIN Card and for OHIP
 - Settlement Support provided (e.g., crisis counselling, employment counselling, language classes, etc...);
 - Those arriving may apply for one time Federal Emergency Financial Assistance (\$3000/adults, \$1500/child) and for 6 months of Provincial Financial Assistance;

Why should we host?

The Need is Great

- As at September 11, well over ½ million displaced Ukrainian Nationals are expected to arrive to Canada:
 - 86,861 have already arrived to Canada
 - 251,922 applications have been approved
 - 559,552 applications have been received

Human Trafficking & Exploitation

- This population is at an increased risk of human trafficking, and sexual/financial exploitation.
- This vulnerability is particularly acute for those that arrive without an established family or support network in Canada.

Housing Crisis

- Most are arriving to Toronto.
- Tight housing/rental market has created a housing challenge for many of the arrived families... HOSTS ARE NEEDED.
- Some hosting programs are inspired by Poland's response to the millions of displaced Ukrainians.

Faith into Action

 Hosting provides the faithful an opportunity to put their faith into action, responding to the suffering of humanity and of our brothers and sisters in Christ, who said, "I was a stranger and you welcomed Me"

While the Church does not have its own hosting program, we are able to refer you to COSTI

About COSTI

- COSTI is a non-governmental organization (NGO). It has a long history and works
 with all levels of government to provide a whole host of services to newcomers
 and refugees to Canada, including providing temporary housing to those arriving
 under the CUAET program.
- It is an independent organization, having no ties to the Church.
- They have initiated their own Ukrainian hosting program, where they match arrived Ukrainians with Canadian hosts

Working with COSTI

- ORAT is able to refer you to the COSTI so that you can participate in their hosting program. They will:
 - Conduct a Host Assessment: What a host is able to provide and for how long;
 - <u>Faciliate Vulnerable Sector Screening:</u> This is done for all individuals above the age of 18. It is done through local police departments at no cost.
 - <u>Site Visit</u>: COSTI will conduct a site visit prior to matching with a newly arrived Ukrainian (AU) family;
 - Matching: COSTI will match a host with an arrived Ukrainian family;
 - MOU: Hosting Agreement signed with the host, the newcomer and COSTI
 - Post Matching Follow-up & Problem Resolution:

Important notes

About who is arriving

 A considerable number of those arriving are intact families, including military age men. These were likely outside of Ukraine prior to the start of the conflict.

Who is most vulnerable?

 The groups that are most vulnerable to human trafficking and sexual/financial exploitation include single women with/out children, seniors, unaccompanied minors.

COSTI Guidelines

COSTI will not place single females in a home where an adult male resides.

Hosts in the driver's seat

 Hosts determine who they would like to host, the duration of the hosting situation; and any additional support that is provided (e.g., meals. Settlement support, community mapping, etc).

Why does the Church not have its own hosting program?

Vicarious Liability

- The hosting program presents a substantial legal liability risk to the Church;
 - Vicarious liability: Canadian Law allows plaintiffs to sue any related party for damages. Consider the example of the survivors of Mount Cashel orphanage, who successfully sued the Diocese of St. Johns placing them into bankruptcy protection, despite the diocese having no direct responsibility over the actions of the Christian Brothers
 - While no litigation has been initiated against the Church regarding its refugee sponsorship work since the beginning of its involvement some 40 years ago, this program is different, as guests are being hosted in people's homes as opposed to being provided with their own rental accommodation.
