

Three common types of bequests:

Residuary Bequest*

is a gift of all the property or its part remaining in the estate after general and specific bequests, debts and taxes have been paid.

General Bequest*

is a gift of a specific amount.

Contingency Bequest

is fulfilled only when specified certain conditions have been met, e.g., when a named beneficiary does not survive you.

* General Bequests tend to lose value over time due to inflation, while Residuary Bequests usually grow with the changing value of the estate. If you would like to keep the original proportion between the value of the monetary gifts in your Will, consider using Residuary Bequests.
