Please note that amounts do not include assets, liabilities and reserves of parishes or other affiliated organizations within the Archdiocese of Toronto.

NOTES TO THE DIOCESAN BALANCE SHEET

Assets

Cash: \$27.4 million of the \$28.6 million is collateral from the Archdiocese held by the bank for loans extended to parishes for construction and restoration work.

Investments: \$52.0 million represents stocks, bonds and short-term deposits reported at fair value.

Loans, receivables, prepayments: \$47.5 million includes \$37.7 million in property loans to parishes.

Properties: \$29.6 million includes diocesan land and buildings, as well as land held for future parish sites.

Special Diocesan Collections: \$1.5 million represents special collections awaiting distribution e.g. Needs of the Canadian Church, Co-operative Mission Plan, etc.

Liabilities

Loans, payables, deferred revenue: \$53.6 million of the \$78.8 million in loans and payables represents funds that parishes have invested with the Archdiocese.

Reserves

Parish Bank Borrowing guarantee: \$27.4 million represents funds set aside as collateral for parish bank loans.

Discretionary funds and other: \$9.6 million constitutes funds set aside to meet special needs of the diocese i.e. purchase of future church sites.

General Reserve Fund: \$16.3 million represents residual between accumulated net revenues and accumulated appropriations.

Accumulated unrealized losses on available-for-sale investments: \$4.0 million represents unrealized losses relative to the cost of investments.

Special diocesan collections: \$1.5 million in liabilities represent the remnant of special collections awaiting distribution.

SUMMARY OF THE 2011 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Revenue

Diocesan revenues increased from \$18.4 million in 2010 to \$22.6 million in 2011 largely due to gains on property sales. Expenditures increased from \$18.1 million in 2010 to \$20.5 million in 2011 due to an increase in grants and programs. The diocese reported net revenue of \$2.1 million in 2011. The General Reserve, after appropriations of \$2.1 million, increased to \$16.3 million.

Parish revenues increased 1.4% from \$130.7 million in 2010 to \$132.6 million in 2011. Parish expenditures remained consistent with the past year with a 0.2% increase from \$106.6 million in 2010 to \$106.7 million in 2011. After appropriations of \$20.8 million to the properties reserve, net revenue for 219 parishes amounted to \$4.9 million.

Capital Expenditures

\$23.0 million was incurred for the construction of new churches and restoration projects involving 121 parishes, as well as the purchase of future parish sites. Proceeds of \$6.0 million were received from the sale of properties.

Parish Investments

At December 31, 2011, 128 parishes maintained cash deposits of \$53.6 million with the diocese, earning 2.5% in interest per annum. These parish funds are used to assist other parishes in need of financing for capital projects.

Parish Debt

Bank loans to 63 parishes totalled \$27.0 million at year-end (2010 - 62 parishes; total: \$29.6 million). These bank loans are funded by the Archdiocese through the provision of cash collateral.

At year-end, property loans by the diocese to 40 parishes largely for the acquisition of land for church sites amounted to \$37.7 million (2010 - 47 parishes, total: \$34.0 million).

Special Diocesan Collections

Parishioners contributed \$11.5 million towards the annual parish ShareLife appeal, which supports Catholic Agencies, missions in developing countries, St. Augustine's Seminary and the Office of Catholic Youth. Collections received and remitted in respect of humanitarian relief efforts amounted to \$1.1 million. In the same period, the corporate community contributed \$1.2 million to the ShareLife Corporate Appeal.

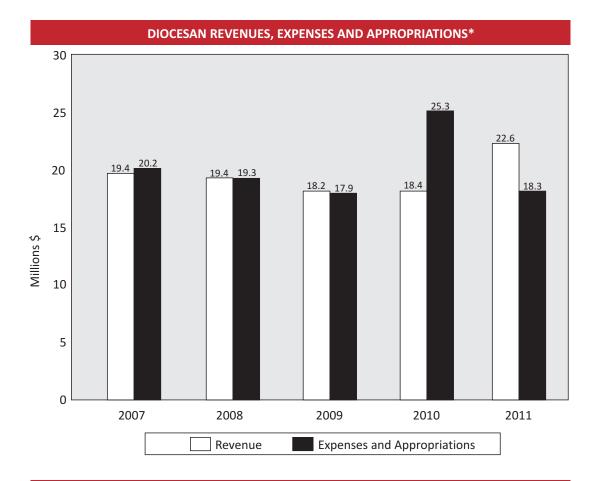

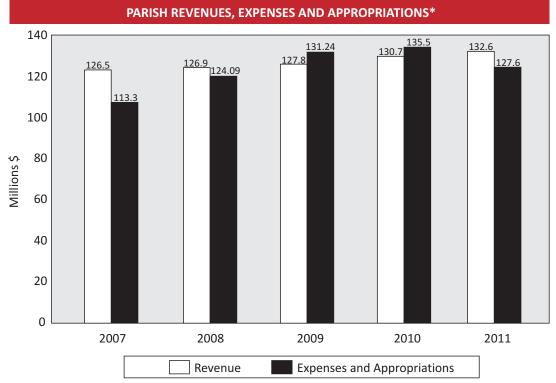
