NOTES TO THE DIOCESAN BALANCE SHEET

Assets

Cash: \$27.4 million of the \$28.2 million is collateral from the Archdiocese held by the bank for loans extended to parishes for construction and restoration work. These funds are therefore restricted from being used for other purposes.

Investments: \$47.2 million represents stocks, bonds and bankers' acceptances reported at fair value, the income from which finances several of our ministries.

Loans, receivables, prepayments: \$49.5 million includes \$39.7 million in property loans to parishes.

Properties: \$29.7 million includes diocesan land and buildings as well as land held for future parish sites.

Special Diocesan Collections: \$1.7 million represents special collections awaiting distribution e.g. Needs of the Canadian Church, Co-operative Mission Plan, etc.

Liabilities

Loans, payables, deferred revenue: \$58.0 million of the \$73.3 million in loans and payables represents funds that parishes have deposited with the Archdiocese.

Reserves

Parish Bank Borrowing guarantee: \$27.4 million represents funds set aside as collateral for bank loans to finance parishes' capital expenditures.

Discretionary funds and other: \$9.6 million constitutes funds set aside to meet special needs of the diocese i.e. purchase of future church sites.

General Reserve Fund: \$14.5 million is the residual between accumulated net revenues and accumulated appropriations.

Special diocesan collections: \$1.7 million in liabilities represent the remnant of special collections awaiting distribution.

SUMMARY OF THE 2012 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Gospel is mobile. Ships, farms, universities, and prisons are some of the places to which we bring the Word of God. A breakdown of expenses on page 4 reflects the range of ministries and communities that the Archdiocese invests in, and without doubt there's need for more. But how does the Archdiocese fund all of these initiatives?

Diocesan Revenue & Expenditures

The Archdiocese is financed by a portion of parishes' income, as well as donations and earnings on capital investments. You'll notice that the Contributions and Grants section on both the diocesan revenue and expenditure side increased nearly \$10 million in 2012. This did not affect net revenue as the contribution was intended for the long-awaited restoration of St. Michael's Cathedral, one of the focuses of our Pastoral Plan. Instead, net revenue decreased from \$2.1 million in 2011 to \$0.472 million in 2012. The general reserve increased \$2.2 million primarily because of the increase in the fair value of investments.

Parish Revenue & Expenditures

Parish revenue and capital expenditure changed in tandem with diocesan revenue and expenditure: the \$12.5 million increase in parish revenue and \$10.5 million increase in capital expenditures is due to the grant to St. Michael's Cathedral, which was then applied to its restoration project. Operating expenses increased \$1.4 million.

Capital Expenditures

The Church takes care to provide both parishioners and the curious with welcoming, inspiring places to encounter the Lord and worship Him together. In 2012, \$31.3 million was incurred for the construction of new churches, restoration projects, and replacement of equipment involving 127 parishes, as well as the purchase of future parish sites. Proceeds of \$1.6 million were received from the sale of properties no longer required.

Parish Deposits with the Archdiocese

All buildings require upkeep and attention, including the House of God in which we gather and from which we go out bearing the Good News. Parishes do their best to raise funds for future capital and operational needs, which they keep on reserve with the diocese until their need arises or they are able to proceed with a project. At December 31, 2012, 126 parishes maintained a reserve of \$58.0 million with the diocese (2011: 128 parishes, \$53.6 million). These funds are also used in the interim to assist other parishes in need of financing for current capital projects.

Parish Debt

The Archdiocese has extended the following loans to parishes to help them address their pressing capital needs where they had a shortfall in building funds:

Bank loans to 61 parishes totalled \$27.1 million at year-end (2011 - 63 parishes; total: \$27.0 million). These loans are for the restoration or construction of parish properties and are backed by cash collateral from the Archdiocese.

At year-end, property loans by the diocese to 42 parishes amounted to \$39.7 million (2011 - 40 parishes, total: \$37.7 million). These loans were extended for the purchase of parish land sites or restoration of parish property.

Special Diocesan Collections

Parishioners contributed \$12.3 million towards the annual parish ShareLife appeal which supports such vital work as that done by Catholic Charities, missions in developing countries, St. Augustine's Seminary, the Office for Refugees and the Office of Catholic Youth. Collections received and remitted in respect of humanitarian relief efforts amounted to \$0.317 million. In the same period, the corporate community contributed \$1.2 million to the ShareLife Corporate Appeal.

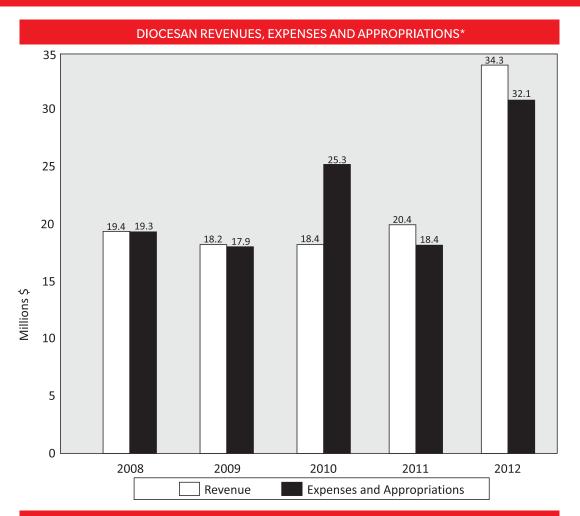
